69/21	<p>To approve the Minutes from the 14th of September and the 07th of October 2021 and matters arising:</p> <p>Proposed: Cllr G Jones Seconded: Cllr K Inglis Resolved: Resolved that the minutes of the 14th of September as a true and accurate record</p> <p>Matters arising from the 14th of September:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Shelters and benches: the first bench is now in situ, they will be bolted when the panels are placed in. New date for this will be Sat 6th November, potentially to be part of the COP26 Global Day of action that are happening that weekend. - County Councillor stated that it is Apple Day on the 23rd October and would like to use the shelters. The Committee agreed to this event with the Clerk requesting risk assessments, covid risk assessments and insurance. The County Councillor will provide these. - Path Planning Application Update: The applications have done and sent in, there is a potential SUDS department query now that Cllr T Jones requested the County Councillor provide help in this case. Cllr G Jones has been sent paperwork with regards to this from the Powys officer, she will send this to the County Councillor in the first instance. 	

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- Accessible Toilet Update: the work is underway (as of yesterday) on the groundworks, Cllr R Jones gave an update, Western Power met him onsite with regards to the electrical cables underneath the existing toilet block. The base needs to be 2.4 metres away from the corner of the toilet block. Cllr T Jones thanked Cllr R Jones for his assistance.
- Accessible Gates Update: Cllr R Jones gave an update on this, The Oak tree on Garn Goch required work to assist with the damage to Garn Goch. This will be worked on in December, the soil from this groundwork will be moved to Garn Goch. Cllr T Jones updated information from the contractor, who is still not available to do this job.
- Christmas Celebrations: Cllr H Burns requested information in relation to the groundworks for the cable. 5.50mm deep, the cable has not been marked. Cllr R Jones stated that it had been marked with a red spray, Cllr R Jones had confirmed this with Western Power Distribution, and he will also correspond with Cllr J Rees in relation to this. Cllr H Burns have requested if the Woodlands group would assist with the tree erection and disposal, the tree does not have a delivery date now, but she will find out.
- Park Signs Update (from Central Services): Cllr R Jones gave an update; it was decided to form a task and finish group to deal with this.
- Log Seating Update: Cllr T Jones stated a massive thank you to all those involved in moving the logs, including Glanusk Estate and the school children who assisted with their placement. They have been gratefully received so far. He requested that the newsletter be sent to the school and the Glanusk Estate.
- Wall Project: Cllr A Williams stated that she and Cllr G Jones are still looking into this.
- Queens Platinum Jubilee Update: Cllr T Jones thanked Cllr H Burns for the updated report on this. Cllr H Burns ran through the report and gave some options, including flame torch procession or fire pits or events. She was wary of some of the options and their associated costs and risks. She will continue to collect views and ideas in relation to this and will report back. Cllr T Jones questioned who would be taking this on, is it the Community Council or the Village Society. Cllr H Burns stated that she would be happy for this to remain with the Village Society with the support of the Community Council. Cllr T Jones thanked the Village Society for taking onboard this project. The County Councillor stated that this would be a great way of engaging with many groups of people within the Village with something fun.

The minutes of the 7th of October will be available at the next meeting, apologies were given by the Clerk for the omission.

- Priorities for 2022/3 budget round

Cllr T Jones introduced this item and shared the priorities that had been agreed already which he ran through with the committee. He believes that the priority should be for next year:

- The path around the recreation ground
- The smaller items that have been held up
- Applying to National Lottery for further play equipment (September 2022)



	<p>Cllr K Inglis bought up benches for the shelters, were four required. Cllr G Jones stated that the original idea was four, but two benches were produced in the end. Cllr T Jones would be happy to use the original priority spreadsheet to make a priority list for the next year (2022-2023)</p> <p>Cllr H Burns stated that the litter item is resolved so can be removed, the learner bike track the Village Society will take up this item after the Christmas event. The County Councillor suggested that there is a project called Caru Cymru</p> <p>Cllr R Jones queried the fence/hedge between the Beechwood and the Recreation Ground, the County Councillor suggested that the Woodland Group may be able to assist with this item. Cllr T Jones stated that the Community Committee would also be happy to assist with funding if necessary.</p> <p>Outside of Perk up the Park Cllr T Jones mentioned that Cllr R Jones wished to talk about Noticeboards and correspondence in relation to bus shelters had been received from the County Councillor.</p> <p>Cllr R Jones stated that the two noticeboards left to replace, one at The Vine Tree and one in the Churchyard. The Vine Tree board location is not a very good location and he suggested that it could be moved elsewhere, this would need agreement from the landowners. Cllr R Jones stated that he could contact the landowners, which would be Park Farm. Cllr T Jones was happy with this and would like to look at pre-planning after this had been achieved.</p> <p>Cllr T Jones spoke in relation to bus shelters, an email was shared in relation to the Powers and duties in relation to this. The County Councillor spoke on this item, there is potential funding from the bus shelter emergency fund, but this would be a shared cost with the position by the roundabout which is owned by Powys County Council. Cllr G Jones stated that there is a possibility that money from the emergency budget could be used to assist with this. Cllr T Jones requested that the County Councillor assist with Powys' preferred provider to investigate the cost and how much we could get from the funding. Cllr H Burns requested if there is a certain design that is required to be used. The County Councillor will investigate further and report back to this meeting. Cllr K Inglis also enquired on the maintenance going forward.</p>
71/21	<p>Correspondence: Fun run Llangattock Park Cllr T Jones introduced this item, a request from the living with dementia society that they use the recreation ground in April 2022. The group have requested for music and alcohol to be available. He opened the floor to the idea of the event.</p> <p>Cllr H Burns supports this idea. She supports the music and the alcohol licence being sought, that is part of living within a community, this is a one-off event. Cllr A Williams agrees with Cllr Burns Cllr G Jones agrees and is happy with the event being licenced. Cllr K Inglis questioned the timing of the event, she is more concerned if it is an evening event. More information would be good to decide. Cllr H Burns stated that the Council could stipulate the times for the event. Cllr R Jones supports this event, as an organised event.</p>
