### **Public Participation**

Llangattock Green Valleys spoke to the Committee in relation to the eco-travel survey that was undertaken in partnership with the community council.

They wished to discuss the results of the electric car charging points, especially those villagers that do not have the ability to have off-road Electric Vehicle (EV) charging points on their property. The survey results suggested that having EV points in the Village would encourage people to buy electric vehicles.

The research LGV have undertaken suggested that achieving break-even on EV charging points does not appear to be easy at this time, or for the first few years after installation. So, this needs to be considered when thinking about the project in future years of operation.

They were interested in discussing any possible locations on Council property or support for other locations in the Llangattock area and asked the question if the Community Council believe that these points would be an asset for the Village.

The Councillors asked questions stemming from this presentation. It was agreed that the Community Committee would take the question of "Do the Community Council believe that electric charging points would be an asset to the Community of Llangattock?" to the next Full Council.

The Council also stated that this committee has an Environment Working Group which the members of LGVs would be welcome to join.
