LGV to also consider if there is a commercial case for working on this with the Rectory. 2) Emergency plan: Approved by P&E committee at Feb 1st Meeting Motion to approve at Full Council: Any other comments? <p>63/21</p>	<p>Active Travel Update (County Councillor)</p> <p>County Councillor J Charlton confirmed that the Active Travel Plan is very much active, she has spoken to officers within Powys to confirm this. There was some concern from Crickhowell Town Council that the plan had been abandoned.</p> <p>Currently the plan is being put forward for funding grants, so it is a case of watch this space.</p> <p>It had been hoped that the resurfacing would have been offset against a successful grant, but that wasn't to be. She is hopeful that if the grant applications are not successful then there will be other opportunities to fund the accessibility issues that have been discussed. She is, however, hopeful that the grants will be successful.</p>
